IDAHO STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE'S

SPRING PESTICIDE DISPOSAL PROGRAM

NAMPA, Idaho – Southwest and north Idaho agricultural producers, dealers, applicators and homeowners who are storing unusable pesticides will once again have a safe, legal and **free**

opportunity to dispose of them this May when the Idaho State Department of Agriculture conducts its annual pesticide disposal collections in Nampa, Weiser, Lewiston and Coeur d'Alene Idaho.

This spring the Idaho State Department of Agriculture expects to break the million pounds mark of unusable pesticides that will have been safely collected and disposed since the program started in 1993.

Participation is free for the first 1,000 pounds of unusable pesticides per participant. Anyone with unusable herbicides, insecticides, fungicides and rodenticides should bring them to the closest collection site between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on the date and location listed below. *No fertilizer, micronutrients, paint, solvents or motor oil can be accepted.*

Participants will also need to register the total number of pounds of pesticides that they are disposing by calling their local ISDA field office or the Nampa field office at (208) 442-2816.
