

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


## Inspections vs. Complaints



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


## Past 10 Years of Complaints

## Noteworthy Investigations, 2018

- **1. Human exposure** 7 and 5 year old kids playing in their yard
- **2. Human exposure** workers unknowingly entered treated area during REI
- **3. Tree Damage** several trees damaged by residual herbicides
- **4. Unlicensed Applicator** structural pest applications without proper license category
- **5. Ornamental damage** herbicide drift on to trees



#### Case #1

Human exposure – kids playing in their yard

- Kids (5 and 7) told their parent that the yellow plane sprayed them as it flew over
- Kids clothing and foliage sample was positive
- Application site was over 300 feet away
- Pilot made applications by flying over homes within city limits

**Action:** Fine & License Suspension



## Idaho Aerial Application Rules LOW FLYING RULES

**LOW-FLYING PROHIBITIONS.** Low-Flying Prohibitions. Aircraft pilots during spray operations are prohibited from turning or low-flying:

- a. Over cities, towns, schools, hospitals and densely populated areas unless the pilot obtains an agreement in writing for pesticide applications from the authorized agent for the city, town, school, hospital, or densely populated area in question; or
- b. Directly over an occupied structure without prior notification by some effective means such as daily newspapers, radio, television, telephone, or door-to-door notice.... -IDAPA 02.02.03.310

## Idaho Aerial Application Rules

ISDA Rules Governing Pesticide And Chemigation Use And Application, IDAPA 02.03.03

#### **HAZARD AREA RULES**

**Hazard Area.** Cities, towns, subdivisions or densely populated areas.
- IDAPA 02.02.03.004.14

**APPLICATION NEAR HAZARD AREAS.** An aircraft pilot shall not apply any pesticide within one-half (1/2) mile of a hazard area unless there is air movement away from the hazard area. - IDAPA 02.02.03.600

#### Case #2

Human exposure – workers unknowingly entered treated area during REI

- No injuries
- Application postponed multiple times
- Improper WPS information exchange

**Action:** Fine

- 1. Application information exchange
- 2. Training
- 3. Personal Protective Equipment

#### Case #3

Tree Damage - caused by residual herbicide applications

- Right-of-way and misuse in residential areas
- Samples positive for bromacil and diuron
- Product labels explicitly state not to use around trees

**Enforcement Actions:** Enforcement letters & Fines





- Good for long term weed control
- When choosing a soil residual herbicide:
  - Consider conditions prior to the application
  - Considerations during the application
  - Consider what can happen after the application

## Prior to the Application

Herbicide selection

Half-life of active?

• Weeds to be controlled?

Product mobility- Leaching, runoff, wind erosion, etc.

READ THE LABEL

- Soil type and texture?
- Slope of treatment area?
- Sensitive areas near the treatment area?



#### Case #4

**Unlicensed Applicator** – structural pest applications without proper license category

- Complainant disappointed with customer service
- Complainant requested applicator's licensing information and reported unlicensed applications
- Applicator advertising structural pest services
- Applicator did not have Structural Pest category

**Action:** Fine & License Suspension

- rangelands. Agriculture Insecticide/Fungicide (AI). Certification in this category shall also certify a person to make insecticide/fungicide applications in rights-of-way, forests, and rangelands. Soil Fungiation (SF). (4-5-00)
- iii. Forest Environment (FE). For U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management personnel, contractors, and private industry personnel who control pests in forests and on rangelands. (3-20-97)
- iv. Right-of-Way Herbicide (RW). For railroads, highway departments and others, for roadside weed control, soil sterilant herbicides, and weed control on public lands (non-crop). Certification in the Agricultural Herbicide category shall exempt the applicant from the need to certify in this category. (3-20-97)
- v. Public Health Pest (PH). For abatement districts and others controlling mosquitoes and other public health pests. (3-20-97)
  - vi. Livestock Pest Control (LP). For persons treating livestock pests. (3-20-97)
- vii. Ornamental Herbicide (OH). For persons conducting outside urban or residential herbicide applications, with the exception of soil sterilant applications (see Subsection 100.02.a.iv.). Ornamental Insecticide/Fungicide (OI). For persons doing outside urban or residential insecticide and fungicide applications, including exterior applications to residential, urban or commercial buildings, excluding structural destroying pests (see Subsection 100.02.a.ix.).
- viii. General Pest Control Operations (GP). For persons controlling pests in and around residential, commercial, or other buildings, excluding structural destroying pests. (3-20-97)
- ix. Structural Destroying Pest (SP). For persons involved in the control of pests which destroy wooden structures, such as bridges, houses, offices, and warehouses. (3-20-97)
- x. General Vertebrate Control (GV). For Wildlife Services (WS) personnel of the United States Department of Agriculture-Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, for controlling vertebrates such as rodents, predators, and birds. (4-5-00)
- xi. Rodent Control (RC). For rodent districts and others, for the control of field rodents. Certification in the General Pest Control category shall exempt the applicant from the need to certify in this category. (3-20-97)
- xii. Aquatic Weed and Pest Control (AW). For irrigation districts, canal companies and others, for weed and pest control on aquatic sites. (4-5-00)

## Case #5

Ornamental damage – herbicide drift on to trees

- Glyphosate onto arborvitae hedge
- Multiple applications neighboring residence
- Buffers were in place
- Symptomology and positive sample results

**Action:** Advisory letters

Pesticide Applications

### **Drones & Pesticides**

- Restricted in spring of 2018 by EPA's pesticide label interpretation
- FIFRA 2ee allows for use of equipment not on the pesticide label as long as it is not prohibited
- Idaho has no license limiting the use of drones for pesticide applications
- "Swarm Technology" = multiple drones in the air under the control of one operator/pilot.
- Forestry and mosquito abatement industry pursuing use in Idaho






